**New Business:**

- Irrigation Issues – Currently cost is \$15 per month and has been at that rate for about 3 years.

- Move Irrigation Billing from RCA for Lakeside Village, Osprey Landing, Royal Oaks and Stonebridge to the actual customers billing. RCA agrees and it can be done as of January Billing Cycle (Feb 1 Bills).
- There has been a significant Uptick in usage billed to us by Charlotte County for the last 3 months.
- There have been significant issues with infrastructure recently.
- Future Rate Changes
  - Beach Club will be discussing increasing party fee to \$150.
  - Charge for Paper Bills from Muni. It costs us around \$1 per bill per month to send out. Should we pass that along to encourage Email bills (which are free)? We are currently paying between \$900 and \$1000 per month on mailings and it will go up with postage increases. Do we want to do this?
