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Riverwood CDD Environmental Committee Meeting Minutes – November 2, 2023

Members Present: Larry Lancette (LL) chair, Brian Murphy, (BM) Bob Daniels (BD) Harry Davis (HD) and John Puzine (JP). Quorum achieved.

Also Present: RCDD Liason Don Myhrberg (DM), RCDD site manager John Mercer (JM), Environmental consultant Tim Hall (TH).

1. Meeting minutes from October 5, 2023 were approved.

2. Lakes

A. Lake 15. Common area recently cleared out by CDD. Landscaping committee will develop vegetation restoration plan. **TH** will review lake shoreline for potential aquatic vegetation plantings. **EC Committee** should identify other CDD lake shorelines in need of aquatic vegetation plantings to mitigate bank erosion. Money is in budget for any future plantings.

B. Stonebridge Aquatic Plant Project. JM reported that fencing keeps getting knocked over by alligator. Aquatic plant growth looks good but the shoreline could be improved by adding more plant diversity.

C. Lake 17 : Spread of water lettuce appears under control. AWC needs to get in the lake with a boat. Lake 16 needs further treatment for blue green algae.

3. Preserves

A. Updated Preserve Exotic Density map handed out to committee. JM discussed herbicide treatment reports.

B. Preserve W1: Resident complaint by Frank/Connie Shorey 14318 Reserve Court. Residents concerned about their view and aesthetics of W1. JM and TH explained that there is a lot of dead vegetation debris due to prior treatment of pepper trees and wet season grasses dying off. **TH** suggested that willow growth could get out of control and will put together an exhibit for next meeting to discuss any further actions. Any willow treatment requires approval by committee.

C. Preserve J2 exotic density. Committee continued discussion about potential treatment options and cost. Per prior meeting, the committee will address this issue at February 2024 EC meeting when all members are present to discuss management options.

D. Preserve O2. Preserve had been modified sometime in the past and converted over to manicured lawn up to edge of Lake 24. Mowing next to the lake has created severe bank erosion. DM and JM spoke to landowner Lee Irish about remediation. CDD property was surveyed and environmental stakes placed to

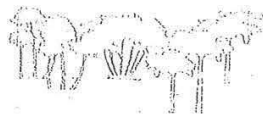
